The priorities set out in the attached portfolio priority statement will also inform chief executive officer performance agreements and shape the functions and activities of departments and agencies.

In delivering on these priorities, please ensure you are working with your federal and other Australian state and territory government counterparts to ensure Queensland's interests are proactively represented and the benefits to Queenslanders are maximised. I will meet with you regularly to discuss progress in implementing the actions identified.

At all times, I expect that ministers and assistant ministers will make all decisions and take all actions in the public's interest, without regard to personal, party political or other immaterial considerations.

We cannot achieve our goals for Queensland without the public service, and I expect that ministers and their staff will engage with chief executive officers and departmental staff with the utmost respect and in accordance with *The Queensland Ministerial Handbook, Ministerial Code of Conduct, Code of Conduct Ministerial Staff Members*' and the *Protocols for communication between ministerial staff members and public service employees.* I refer you to Governing Queensland for the suite of policy and administrative handbooks, which is available on the Department of the Premier and Cabinet's website at www.premiers.qld.gov.au.

Delivery Priorities

Agriculture

Continue to deliver the Queensland Low Emission Agriculture Roadmap 2022–2032 and the Queensland AgTech Roadmap, and support industry-led strategies to enable the sector to sustainably adapt to the global challenges of climate change and technological advance.

Continue drought policy reform, to ensure the agriculture sector is prepared and resilient in responding to drought in a changing climate.

Continue to deliver drought assistance programs to support producers in managing the drought cycle, including Drought Preparedness Grants and recovery loans.

Promote rural economic development through the support of both traditional food and fibre products as well as encouraging niche, new and emerging products.

Continue to promote collaboration between industry and government through the Agricultural Ministerial Advisory Council.

Improve and expand growth in international markets for agribusiness and exports to meet a rising demand for food security, in consultation with the Deputy Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Trade and Investment.

Build and strengthen partnerships with research organisations, industry bodies and government agencies to leverage expertise and share responsibility for managing

Support local solutions to meet the seasonal workforce needs of Queensland's agribusinesses.

Continue the Government's work in conjunction with stakeholders to manage wild dogs and feral pests, including through the successful cluster fencing initiative.

Deliver the Rural Agricultural Development grants to sheep and goat meat producers, and related business to build their capacity and meet the growth of the industry occurring in Queensland.

Implement policies to reduce community harm associated with dangerous dogs.

Maintain and enhance Queensland's biosecurity capability to protect the state's agriculture and the environment.

Develop, monitor, and enforce animal welfare policy and legislation including implementing recent changes to the Animal Care and Protection Act 2001 and measures to prioritise community safety and promote responsible dog ownership related to the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008.

Help to educate the community about animal welfare and standards of care. including any changes to penalties that result from updates to the Animal Care and Protection Act 2001.

Deliver the Enhancing Local Government Biosecurity Capacity in Far North Queensland initiative to work in partnership with local councils on invasive pest control planning and to improve biosecurity capacity in Far North Queensland. Continue oversight of the joint Fire Ant Suppression Taskforce to demonstrate

Queensland's commitment to the new National Red Imported Fire Ant Eradication Program.

Forestry

Facilitate the implementation of the Native Timber Action Plan commitments including for native timber harvesting, plantation program and protected areas.

Oversee the development and implementation of a policy on the future of timber production in state-owned native forests in close consultation with industry, government, the conservation sector, and relevant experts. Continue to conduct commercial and environmentally responsible business activity for the allocation and sale of state-owned quarry material.

Fisheries

Continue to implement the Queensland Sustainable Fisheries Strategy 2017–2027 to reduce red tape, support economic recovery and improved management, ensure the sustainability of Queensland's fisheries resources and fishing industry, and play its role in helping to protect the Great Barrier Reef.

Biosecurity

Deliver a legislative framework for recreational and commercial fishers that is contemporary, simple to understand, and reflective of community expectations.

Support the Cape York Special Fisheries Group to work with key stakeholders in Cape York to allow traditional owners to utilise charter fisheries and tourism operations to attract new economic pathways, whilst ensuring sustainable fisheries are maintained.

Continue to review and adapt the Shark Control Program in line with emerging science, technology and community expectations.

Ensure that fisheries legislation is enforced in a manner that is fair, transparent, consistent and achieves an optimal level of compliance.

Work closely with the Minister for the Environment and the Great Barrier Reef, Minister for Science and Innovation to implement Great Barrier Reef fisheries reforms in accordance with the outcomes of the recommendations of the Future Fisheries Taskforce and to report back to the UNESCO World Heritage Committee.

Work to support the development of a diverse aquaculture industry by delivering a Queensland aquaculture strategy, ensuring world best practice, sustainable practices and encouraging sound investment.

Rural Communities

Continue to work with rural communities to identify regional economic opportunities, improve the competitiveness of rural business and support the creation of jobs in rural communities.

Help rural communities and industry to promote economic continuity, development, and new investment.

Boost rural business competitiveness through research, innovation and adaptation across primary industries and regions to create jobs and exports to grow the economy.

Work with the Minister for Health, Mental Health and Ambulance Services and Minister for Women and contribute to delivering health care to rural areas.
